

# ARM Quick Guide to Professional Accreditation

## A Quick Guide to the Appraisal Review & Management (ARM) Accreditation Program

It's as easy as One, Two, Three.

**Step 1: Become a Candidate Member of ASA**

- Pass ASA's Online Ethics Exam;
- Pass USPAP Exam (if applicable)

**Step 2: Complete Education Requirements**

- Pass the four ARM Principles of Valuation (POV) Courses (AR201-204)

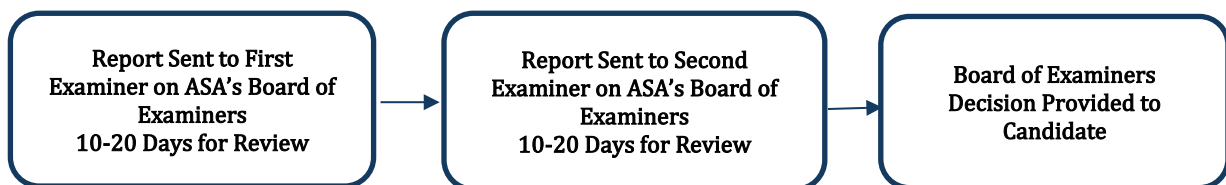
**Step 3: Apply for Accredited Member (AM) or Accredited Senior Appraiser (ASA) Designation**

Candidates who have met the ARM accreditation criteria are ready to submit an online accreditation application which includes:\*

- Proof of education
- An Appraisal Experience Log documenting two (2) years of full-time experience for the AM designation and five (5) years of full-time experience for the ASA designation.
- An appraisal report(s) for peer-review and required client/ report release forms
- A current USPAP certificate (if required)
- Submission of completed online accreditation application

### Report Peer-Review Process



**Accredited Member (AM) Designation**

If you have two to five (2-5) years of full-time appraisal experience.

**Accredited Senior Appraiser (ASA) Designation**

If you have five (5) years or more of full-time appraisal experience.
